I have learned more about your Columbia Seminar on December 10. No one is expecting you to present a paper to the students, but Friendly would like your considered and coherent views on a number of current communications topics. As I understand it, you would be expected to "clear the air" as to your own position on such issues as: (1) our license renewal bill; (2) VHF drop-ins; (3) cable and our report; and (4) the general government-media relationship, pointing out the paranoia on both sides.

I also passed on your desire to have a more informal session with the Columbia Journalism and Law School faculty members who specialize in communications. Friendly would love to sponsor either a luncheon or a dinner for you on the 10th so that you could meet with between five and ten such faculty stalwarts. You could have lunch at the Ford Foundation and Friendly would have Bundy attend. Alternatively, we have been invited to dinner at Friendly's home after the class, but it is unlikely that Bundy would be able to attend. The decision is up to you and it probably should turn on whether you want to meet Bundy in an informal atmosphere.





Items 1 through 4: Self-explanatory.

Items 5 and 6: If these locations are in a regional office, enter the regional location (city and State) and the regional number; if located in GSA Central Office, enter Washington, Central Office.

Item 7: Show the specific purpose of the travel. Generalizations, such as "Official Business" or similar phrases are not acceptable. Indicate why the desired results cannot be gained through correspondence or other less-expensive means than travel.

Item 8: Enter the scheduled dates of the first and last days of the travel period.

Item 9: Check whether the form represents an original or an amended authorization.

Items 10 and 11: If the form amends a previous authorization, enter the original authorization number in Item 10 and the item number(s) being amended in Item 11.

Item 12: If trip order, specify in sequence and by date each official point to be visited and, if known, the address at destination where the traveler can be reached. If authorization covers travel within specified States, list the States.
