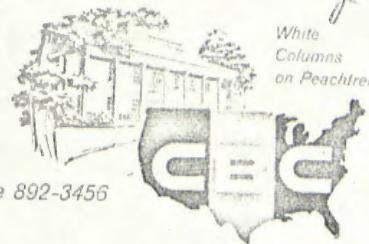


As I mentioned, the Florida CATV Association is most anxious to have you as their dinner speaker Thursday, March 29 at Daytona Beach.





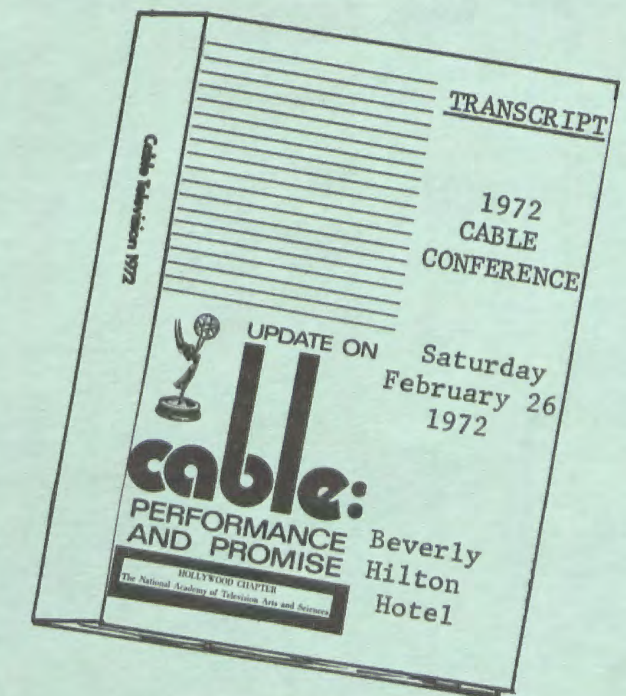
