(BROADCEST)

MASHINGTON (UPI) -- CLRY WHITEHEAD, DIRECTOR OF THE WHITE HOUSE OFFICE OF TELECORMUNICATIONS, SAID WEDNESDAY THAT THE MAJOR PROBLEMS IN THE BROADCASTING INDUSTRY ARE BEHIND THE SCREEN "AND I DON'T MEAN THE TRANSISTORS OR TUBES."

WHITEHERD TOLD A DROUP OF DROPPEASTERS AT THE NATIONAL SKURDARSTING EDITORIAL ASSOCIATION (NEED) THAT THE ANSWERS TO THE TRUBLERS IN TELEVISION MUST COME FROM THE STATIONS THERSELVES AND NOT FROM UNVERNMENT CONTROL.

"SHATEVER THE PROBLEMS OF BRONDCASTING TODAY ... THEY WILL NOT BE

SOLVED BY REMOVING 15T AMENDMENT RIGHTS," HE SAID.

STRESSING THAT TELEVISION HAS NOW A NATURE MEDIUM AND "THE IMPORTANT MEDIUM." WHITEHEAD SAID THE LOCAL BROADCHSTER WOST EXPLORE THE HOUS AND WHYS OF THE INDUSTRY.

WE MUST KNOW MAY HE SEE WHAT HE SEE ON TELEVISION, HE SAID.

IN A LOW-KEY SPEECH, THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CHIEF RECOMMENDED THAT BRANDCASTERS READ A BROOKINGS INSTITUTE STUDY OR THE ECONOMIC ASPECTS OF TELEVISION BROADCASTING

THE BROOKINGS STUDY RECOMMENDED THAT THE NUMBER OF NATIONAL NETWORKS BE DOUBLED AND CALLED FOR MORE COMPETITION WITH THE INDUSTRY TO LESSEN THE NEED FOR GOVERNMENT REGULATION.

"WORE COMPETITION NATIONALLY CANNOT BE ACHIEVED BY GOVERNMENT FIRT, BY DOING AWAY WITH LOCAL STATIONS," HE SAID. "WE NEED THE LOCAL STATIONS."

"WHETHER YOU AGREE WITH THE REPORT OR NOT, THIS KIND OF AMALYSTS HAS TO COME . . . BECAUSE CHANGES HAVE TO COME . "

WHITEHEAD THEN CAPSULIZED HIS CONTROVERSIAL INDIANAPOLIS SPEECH, DELIVERED DEC. 18, IN WHICH HE OUTLINED A MIXON ADMINISTRATION PROPOSAL FOR EXTENDING BROADCASTING LICENSES FROM 3 TO 5 YEARS, AND ADDED THE PHRASES "IDEOLOGICAL PLUGGOLA" AND "FAIRNESS DOCTRINE" TO THE INDUSTRY'S TERMINOLOGY.

THE THAT SPEECH HE EMPHASIZED THAT THE PRINCIPLE OF FREE PRESS MUST ALSO BE FULLY APPLIED IN BRORDCASTING AND CALLED UPON LOCAL STATIONS TO TAKE TIME TO REBUT NETWORK NEWSCASTS. HE REITERSTED THAT THE ADMINISTRATION'S PROPOSED BILL MOULD PROVIDE "MORE INSULATION FROM THE FCC," AND MAKE LOCAL STATIONS MORE RESPONSIVE TO THE PUBLIC. BUT, HE SAID, "I BM NOT OPTIMISTIC FOR CHANCES OF PASSAGE OF THE BILL --SIMPLY BECAUSE THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION PROSPOSED IT."
