# Watergate Seeps Into Green Book

Publishers of the Social List of Washington known from its green suede jacket as, The Green Book, are having trouble putting out their annual fall edition.

The February '73 Executive and Congressional Supplement was "not worth a tinker's damn," says pub-lisher Carolyn Hagner Shaw.

That statement translated and updated means: By the time the official lists got to the printers - after weeks of delay - most of the persons had been either removed from their jobs or reslotted.

THE SUPPLEMENT still placed John D. Ehrlichman and H. R. Haldeman as number two and three men to the President; John W. Dean III remained, counsel to the President.

But Charles Colson was already missing as was Jeb

Stuart McGregor.

The same problem faces those putting out the Fall Edition. Publishers from all over the United States are calling to know if, in the wake of Watergate, there will be a fall edition. Publications use the volume as a reference for official and social Washington, an entwined duo.

"There will be a rall publication," says Mrs. Shaw firmly, leaving little doubt that it will come out, even if after six days of issuance the official listing may have no relevance

Mrs. Hagner, daughter of the founder of the list, Helen Ray Hagner, puts out

what many people consider the "must" list. At her Georgetown home around the corner from her P Street office, reedy and cool Callie Shaw is asked, "Is there actually a board which passes on the names for the Green Book?" (Washingtonians have always doubted the existence of such a board, believing Mrs. Shaw to be the oneman court.)

"Of course there's such a board, and with the situation the way it is I could not be more thankful," is the

positive assertion.

In the '69 (the first Green Book after Nixon became President) there is a listing for Dr. Henry Kissinger, Assistant to President Nixon on National Security Affairs, 2526 Waterside Drive (No phone listed).

The durable Kissinger remains today with the same title but the address is now, in care of the White

House.

In 269, another listing read: Deputy Attorney General and Mrs. John

Wesley Dean III (Karla Hennings) with local and New York addresses.

In the "not worth a tinkers damn" supplement, Dean survives as counsel to the President, alone at 100 Quay Street, Alexandria. Va. He had not yet married the statuesque blonde who backed him up throughout last week's long televised Senate hearings.

Perusing the rolls from old Green Books, one finds the missing outnumber the remnants: Donald Rums feld, Robert Finch, Clark MacGregor, Peter Peterson, Charles Colson, Emil Krogh, Dwight Chapin, James Keogh, John Mitchell, Clifford Hardin, Walter J. Hickel, Maurice Stans, James Hodgson, Mrs. Constance Stuart, William Sa-fire, Charles Wilkinson, George Romney, etc., etc., etc., etc., etc.-

Away from the political list Mrs. Hagner is more sure of herself. "No one who is in the process of being divorced can be in." She has weakened a little. Many who have been divorced and remarried, or who remain separated, can get back in.

"If we don't actually know they are not living together how can we put them out?" she languished over today's habits and over discovering that some of her Mr. and Mrs. listings are not exactly kosher.
