

Nathan Glazer - Sociologist

Glazer's chief concern appears to be the preservation of the diversity and uniqueness of ethnic groups. Big Government has the capacity to provide and balance opportunities between all groups in our country but unrestrained Government interference can all too easily destroy the humanizing effects of ethnic cultures. Glazer fought against locating low-income housing in Forest Hills, N.Y. for this very reason--ill-conceived attempts by the Government which would de-ethnicize the area and destroy what uniqueness and diversity this ethnic culture provided for its residents.

Daniel Bell - Sociologist

Author of End of Ideology. Bell, like Glazer, Wilson, Moynihan, and Kristol, is a liberal of the old stripe, or as they have been often called, "Cold War Liberals." All of these men are presently critical of the trends taking place within the liberal circles. Bell has written critically of the new left's "greening of America" approach to capitalism. Essentially in favor of Government regulation, Bell would probably favor, as Wilson, a substantial revamping of present regulatory structures.

James Q. Wilson - Political Scientist

Wilson is the major expert in this country on urban politics: Civil Rights in the ghetto, city government, Mayor Daley, etc.... He was in the same Conference Board program as you this summer and the following is a quote from him directly relating to the regulatory framework of communications: (Taken from the Conference Board Record of June, 1972).

"That statutory peg (FCC Act of 1934), plus a good deal of loose language surrounding it, have provided in subsequent

years an opportunity for the courts and various commissions to expand their range of interests to a point where now we have a very substantial intermix of government constraint and regulation on the one hand, and private initiative on the other hand.... I hope that during the next decade we can take a clearer look at the regulatory structure we have and ask how--by more precise language, better practice, and new modes of departure--we can insure that the public maintains maximum advantage from the new technologies that are before us."

Bruce Owen says Wilson is very good but perhaps not aware of OTP's existence. It would be worth informing him especially if, as Kristol indicates, he is writing a book on government regulation.

The rest of those that will attend the dinner have generally a low public profile and a few brief comments are about all that is generally available.

Irving Kristol

Kristol "believes CATV is the ultimate salvation of the world."

Robert Solow - Economist

A McGovern man but, according to Bruce Owen, anti-Galbraithian.

Roger Starr

Starr knows all there is to know about housing.

Leo Rosten

Author of Joys of Being Yiddish and generally a "very congenial, intelligent person."

George Will from Senator Allott's office (speechwriter) attended last year's publication committee dinner. He said it was comprised of the above type of scholars and a group of highly intelligent, public spirited Wall-Streeters. These men were primarily interested in the kinds of articles Public Interest should publish, how political they should be, how much advance publicity they should have etc....

At the dinner last year, they went around the table asking the participants to comment generally on their work, their philosophies, their uppermost interests.... Since the majority of participants were philosophically non-dogmatic, a strong, empirical bias appeared to impress them the most.
